Parks & Reticulation Report

he major projects for the year being the rewire of the Reticulation system is now well advanced with the rewiring itself 95% complete by the end of July and the new control systems installed in the office.

There still remains the fitting of decoders and valves throughout the estate.

It is expected that the system will be commissioned and testing performed during the first week of September so expected random watering events during that week.

We have recently appointed a new assistant gardener following John's resignation, please say hello to Peter if you see him around the estate.

It has been bought to my attention that we have many outbreaks of Japanese/Brazillian pepper tree throughout the estate and members backvards

This plant is a declared weed in NSW and QLD. It is poisonous to humans and animals. It contains toxic resins and is a relative of poison lvy. Some people may suffer severe itching, lesions, rashes, reddening and swelling of the face, running sores and welts associated with the sap and flowering trees.

It is in full bloom at the moment with bright red berries so is easy to identify for removal, if you are unsure give our gardener Rich a call and he can quickly identify it for you.

Pool Report August 2015

W ith the pool closed over winter this is has traditionally been the time when any major maintenance is carried out. This year there is nothing major to be done with regard to the pool itself.

Some of the gates will be replaced as they are wearing out or no longer up to standard. However, the committee has decided to replace the shade sails around the main pool. Currently half the sails are tearing every year, at great cost to repair. They have had their day, and will be replaced with sails of the same design that covers the toddler's pool (it was replaced last year). As they will be installed in October by the supplier there will be no need for a busy bee.

Something else that will be new this year is that the pool application form and schedule will be hand delivered to every post box. Time and technology have moved on. Both the application form and schedule will be available on the website to down load from September 13th. If you would personally still prefer to have them printed and delivered, please contact me, and I will arrange it.

Currently the only pool users are the ducks who visit every winter. No sign of ducklings as yet. At this stage I anticipate that the pool will open on Saturday October 24th. Like many Crestwood residents I am looking forward to the warm weather and the chance to use this great facility.

Welcome eWatch subscribers to the weekly report from the Canning Vale Local Policing Team.

WA Police have launched Operation Quadrangle to reduce the incidence of Graffiti vandalism, increase intelligence and minimize harm to the community from graffiti offending by identifying and prosecuting offenders through evidence based policing.

Police are actively engaging with Local Government Agencies to increase intelligence in order to successfully identify and prosecute offenders. Police will be targeting known graffiti offenders and repeat victims of graffiti in order to prevent further vandalism and obtain sufficient evidence with a view of charging offenders with committing an offence.

- Cowden's has confirmed that all Crestwood's General Insurance policies have been renewed.
- Toro Australia has emailed responses to questions about the Sentinel system.
- Two emailed quotes have been received from Western Irrigation see Parks and Reticulation.
- A second letter has been received from a resident of Hume requesting a response to their April letter listing various concerns including Hume Road frontages and Public Utilities being able to access the front of their property.

Correspondence out:

- Trevor has responded to Graeme & Carol Ferris of 22 Grenadier thanking Graeme for his past time on the committee and his helpful advice to Crestwood Groundsmen.
- Approval given to resident of Coronet Court to erect a patio.
- Approval sent to resident of Grenadier Drive to erect a fence at the rear.

FROM THE MINUTES

REPORTS

- Trevor responded to a residents letter letting him know that: Roy identified
 that a couple of items listed were in fact Capital Expenditure with funds from the Sinking Fund and not Operating
 Funds and these have been rectified.
- Roy has kindly agreed to assist with compilation of the End of Year Financial Report to present to the Auditor.
- The Treasurer's position is being considered by the Committee, keeping in mind that Crestwood is in fact a small business with operating costs now exceeding \$400,000 and assets in excess of that amount.

Reports / Issues Arising:

- Western Irrigation has forwarded a quote for Maintenance to Bore 1 Approval given out of session to go ahead and the Bore maintenance is now in progress.
- John Ecclestone submitted his resignation with his final working day on 29 April.
- The Committee needs to discuss how to fill the remaining 12 months of the Treasurer's two year term. To this end, hourly rates from a number of book-keeping firms have been obtained with a view to assessing whether the books should be professionally managed for the Treasurer. *Discussion ensued at the meeting and is ongoing.*

COMMITTEE MEETING Monday 6 July 2015

Visitor Business:

• A resident welcomed the new President and brought up the following issues: Honorariums; the size of the sinking fund; outdoor chairs need cleaning; notices at the pool showing times / water temperature; Brazilian peppercorn trees; backyard debris; adults bathing in the toddlers' pool; pool passes; cost to run the pool; motor bikes in parks; doggie bags on park bins.

Correspondence in:

- Email received from Cowden's in response to a query on Workers' Compensation coverage for working on the Hume Road verges. Cowden's have confirmed there is full coverage for any injuries sustained roadside with no restrictions in terms of location.
- Ligeti Partners, Lawyers, emailed regarding the large tree that damaged a property on Hume on 11 January 2014.
 Rich's response was forwarded to Ligeti to the effect that Crestwood had no involvement in either inspecting or removing the tree.
- Canon Hygiene has notified a 3.93% increase in current charges as of 1 July 2015.
- Advice has been received from Cowden's to confirm the renewal of our Workers' Compensation policy.
- Email from Western Irrigation relating to a quote for a pool pump upgrade. (See also under **Pool**)

Correspondence out:

- Letter from Trevor Davis plus 3 attachments to a resident of Regency re the private sale of his property.
- Letter sent to COG re current Office Bearers for the Management Committee.
- Roy has emailed the Wages Statement to Cowden's and requested they arrange renewal of our Workers' Compensation Policy by the due date.
- Emails to Optus relating to negotiations to change telecom provider from Telstra to Opus at a saving of around \$1,000 per annum
- Letter sent to Mr Nick Toh, Optus Business Centre Perth, regarding the Transfer of Accounts from Telstra to Opus.
- Email to Cowden's to arrange insurance for Rich's new I-phone 6.

Reports / Issues Arising:

- The Parks & Reticulation report for June has been submitted.
- Park lights various options are available, Frazer to follow up.

- Rich has delivered "request for maintenance" letters to 15 neglected properties.
- The reticulation upgrades commenced the weekend of 27-28 June. Frazer reported we're still on budget.
- In response to a residents concerns relating to a large tree at the rear of his FROM THE MINUTES **REPORTS** property at Hume Rd, Mark Short, Coordinator Environmental Operations at COG examined the tree and advised that is very healthy, in excellent condition and therefore no action need be taken. Resident to be notified.

Aesthetics

- Resident was notified on 10 June that his application to erect a shed at Regency was approved.
- Resident was notified that his application to erect a fence at the rear of his property at Grenadier was approved
- An amended proposal for the rear fence at a property on Regency was submitted. Serkan to contact resident to let him know that the Committee's preference is for 50% solid and 50% open as per the Fencing Guidelines.

Pool

- Darren advised he has dealt with this pump proposal on a number of previous occasions, advising that there are complex design and operational issues and that it would not prove cost-effective. Therefore he once again advises against installing this type of pump.
- Darren has advised of security issues with the pool chemicals area having been left unlocked on two occasions.
- Brian reported that he had seen young kids on bikes lurking around the shed area.

Treasurer:

- The Treasurer's report was not submitted.
- The tax invoice for public open space maintenance has been sent to COG.
- Frazer has suggested looking at strata corporate body management services. They would do everything from collecting fees, organising maintenance contractors and keeping accounts, plus they would be audited.
- Treasurer's position. In response to Frazer's suggestion, Brian approached the strata management company De Freitas & Ryan. They would prepare our budget, generate invoices for home owner fees, pay creditors, manage payroll and attend Committee meetings. They are also subject to auditing under their licence agreement. De Freitas & Ryan advise that they're unable to quote for their services until they have visited the estate, examined a previous budget, personally addressed the Committee and gained a better understanding of our needs.
- Brian announced that as an interim measure, Roy Malone had volunteered to return to the position until after our next AGM in May 2016. This would give the Committee a period of grace in which to find a solution, keeping in mind that the Office of Honorary Treasurer must be held by a home owner.
- Brian thanked Niki for all the work she had done as Treasurer.

Discussion relating to:-

• Formulating a Code of Conduct; Standing Orders; Email language and tone used in email communications; generic email accounts for each Committee position; President/Member contacts; laminated map with the estate's drainage marked out on it, for display in the hall.

If you happen to be walking though underpass "D", take a moment to appreciate Rich and Peters recent project.

These changes do not happen without a lot of effort and hard work.







Up to 50 people are allowed in the Hall. Full use of the kitchen is included for both day and night functions.

Commercial (for-profit events or those charging an entry fee) — \$25.00 per hour to a maximum of \$100.00 – 8am - 5pm
A \$300 bond applies to all bookings made by homeowners and \$500 to those bookings made by tenants. A minimum cleaning charge of \$150 will be taken from the bond if the hall is not cleaned to a satisfactory standard.

Hall hire does not include access to the pool area. For children's parties there is a minimum adult supervision requirement.
